Pacific Heron. Recorded occasionally.

White-faced heron. Often present.

Cattle Egret. Rare

Marsh Sandpiper. Rare

Sharp-tailed Sandpiper. Rare

Pectoral Sandpiper. Rare in the park and uncommon elsewhere

Silver gull. Common

Whiskered Tern. Occasional visitor

Common Tern. A summer visitor

Little Tern. Occassional visitor in summer

Topknot Pigeon. Very rare

Peaceful Dove. Rare

Bar-shouldered Dove. Rare. One record (1982)

Crested Pigeon.

Galah. Common at times in large flocks

Long-billed Corella. Regular

Little Corella. Occasional visitor in small flocks

Sulphur-crested Cockatoo. Regular

Rainbow Lorikeet. Seen on most occasions

King Parrot. Rare

Red-winged Parrot. An escapee

Buderigar. An aviary escapee

Crimson Rosella. A rare straggler

Eastern Rosella. A breeding resident

Horsfield's Cuckoo. Mainly spring and summer months

Golden Bronze Cuckoo. Records for every month

Common Koel. A summer migrant

Channel-billed Cuckoo. A rare summer migrant

Southern Boobook. An occasional visitor

Barn owl. One summer record

Tawny Frogmouth. An uncommon breeding resident

Spine-tailed swift. A summer migrant from east Asia

Azure kingfisher. A former breeding resident, now rare.

Laughing Kookaburra. A breeding resident.

Dollarbird. A passage migrant. Irregular

Welcome Swallow. Common

Tree Martin. Uncommon

Fairy Martin. Uncommon

Australian Pipit. Once commonly seen in small numbers, now rare.

Black-faced Cuckoo-shrike. A breeding resident

White-winged Triller. A rare summer migrant

Rose Robin. An autumn and winter nomad. Rare

Eastern Yellow Robin. A breeding resident

Jack winter. Once common, now rare

Golden Whistler. A regular nomad

Rufous Whistler. A regular breeding summer migrant

Black-faced monarch. An irregular passage migrant

Satin Flycatcher. A rare passage migrant

Restless Flycatcher. Once regular, now rare

Rufous Fantail. A regular autumn and winter visitor

Willy wag tail. A common breeding resident

Clamorous Reed Warbler. Once common, now in less numbers through lack of breeding situations

Little Grassbird. Once common, now rare

Golden-headed Cisticola. Once common, now rare, through habitat clearing

Superb Fairy-Wren. A breeding resident

Southern Emu Wren. Not recorded since early part of century

Brown Warbler. An uncommon winter nomad

White-throated Warbler. A rare passage migrant

Yellow-Rumped Thornbill. A breeding resident

Yellow Thornbill. A common breeding resident

Red Wattlebird. Rare winter visitor

Little Wattlebird. A rare visitor

Noisy Friarbird. A rare straggler

Noisy Miner. A small colony

Yellow-faced Honeyeater. A migratory winter visitor

White-Plumed Honeyeater. A common breeding resident now rare
