# Frequently Asked Questions about events in Centennial Parklands

#### What is the event?

On Saturday 1 December, *The Sydney Craft Beer and Food Festival*, presented by BeerFest Australia, will be held in Centennial Park. The Festival will take festival-goers on a journey of beer and food discovery; exploring rare brews, beer/food pairing and unique recipes at free Masterclasses and tasting exclusive festival brews from around the Country, direct from the brewers themselves.

Announcing the biggest and boldest Craft Beer & Food Festival to date – with the best music, comedy and craft brew line-up. Centennial Parklands offers the perfect viewing for the epic main stage entertainment. Over 300 unique and small batch craft beers, ciders, cocktails and wines, hand crafted and perfectly complemented by Sydney's most decadent local street food.

### Which areas of Centennial Parklands are impacted by this event and when?

Sydney Craft Beer and Food Festival will be held at Brazilian Fields in Centennial Park. An event of this size requires a number of days to install and dismantle the infrastructure. Installation will commence on Wednesday 28 November 2018 with the site fenced off to the general public for safety reasons. The event site will be reopened to the public on Tuesday 4 December 2018.

During the construction period, large vehicles and event suppliers will be required to access the event site at Brazilian Fields. Traffic control will be in place on the corner of Parkes Drive and Dickens Drive to manage safe and authorised vehicle access. Please note this may cause minor traffic delay so we ask that you please comply with traffic controller directions during this time for your own safety.

I am not attending the event, will I still be able to access Centennial Parklands on the event day/s?

Yes, you will still be able to access Centennial Park on the event day however traffic congestion is expected.

#### What will the traffic and access impacts be?

There will be parking limitations on Parkes Drive in Centennial Park due to an event patron drop off zone. We recommend you plan your trip and use public transport here.

- Road Closures: There are road closure in place from 6:00 am to 11:00 am on Dickens Drive on event day. Please expect traffic delays while the event is on.
- **Gate Closures:** There are no gate closures planned in relation to this event. Randwick, Robertson Road and Paddington exit gates will remain open until 8:00 pm for event patron exit. All other gates will operate as per normal.
- **Parking restrictions:** There will be parking limitations on Parkes Drive in Centennial Park due an event patron drop off zone.
- Mobility Pass Holder access: A drop off zone will be operating on Parkes Drive near the event entry. Parking is as per normal parking conditions within the Park.
- **Horse and rider access:** There is no planned closure of the horse track related to this event.
- Cyclist and Rollerblader access: There is no anticipated impact to the cycle lane related to this event. Cyclists should exercise due care and caution whilst large vehicles are in the Park.

#### Will Centennial Parklands Homestead be open as usual?

Centennial Parklands dining will be open as usual. All Centennial Parklands playgrounds will also be open.

Will the Centennial Park Cycle Hire still be operating?

Yes.

Will the Spruce Goose still be operating?

Yes.

Will the Greenhouse Cafe still be operating?

Yes.

Will the Bar Coco still be operating?

Yes.

#### Will there be any sound impacts related to this event?

Sydney Craft Beer and Food Festival is not a music event however there will be amplified sound and music as part of the event atmosphere.

Sound check times will be Friday 30 November from 12:00 pm to 1:00 pm and Saturday 1 December 2018 from 11:00 am to midday and event sound from 1:15 pm to 7:45 pm. The event hotline number is (02) 9339 - 6616 during sound operating times.

We work closely with the Office of Environment and Heritage (OEH) and are committed to comply with all legislation and guidelines covering permissible sound levels at outdoor events. This includes pre-event sound checking, as well as event day monitoring and management of noise levels to adjust according to the prevailing weather conditions (e.g. wind strength and direction).
