### Helpful information for dog owners/carers

Dogs are very welcome in Centennial Parklands with over 43% (158 hectares) of the Parklands designated off leash areas, making it one of the largest off leash areas in Greater Sydney.

This information and map provides a summary of the Centennial Parklands dog policy. The Centennial Park and Moore Park Trust is not responsible for the actions of dogs in the Parklands. For more detailed information please visit **centennialparklands.com.au/dogs** 

#### Off leash zones (see map):

Dogs are allowed off leash in dedicated areas in Centennial Parklands and must be under effective control at all times.

#### Dogs must be on leash in these areas (see map):

- within 10 metres of ponds and waterways
- on all roads and shared paths, including footpaths and cycle lanes
- in the front lawn of the Superintendents Residence
- within 10 metres of horse access corridor near Robertson Rd Gates

#### Dog are prohibited in these areas (see map):

- within 10 metres of all children's playgrounds
- within 10 metres of the Learners Cycleway
- within 10 metres of Centennial Parklands Childcare Centre
- horse areas including the horse track
- wildlife protection areas including ponds, waterways, the Bird Sanctuary and York Road Bushland
- on playing fields when they are in use
- within 10 metres of Federation Pavilion, as bounded by the stone circle in the lawn (to protect its heritage significance)
- within 10 metres of food preparation and consumption areas at Centennial Parklands Dining, Queens Park Shed, the Ponds Kiosk and BBQ areas. Tethered dogs must be supervised and remain the responsibility of their owner/carer

#### General

- Maximum 4 dogs per person under effective control
- Tethered dogs must be supervised and remain the responsibility of their owner/carer
- Dogs should be kept away from ponds, pond banks, long grass and shrubs, which are sensitive areas and home to native fauna.

#### Dogs and horses

Dogs and horses don't mix. Please keep your dog well clear of horses and their riders as horses can cause serious injury if they are chased, bitten or barked at.

#### Dog waste

It is an offence not to immediately pick up and dispose of your dog's faeces and fines can apply. In case you forget, Centennial Parklands provides courtesy bag dispensers. See map for locations.
