



Indigenous Environments

Stage 1 Geography & Science/Technology

Learn about the natural environment and how it has been used by Australia's Indigenous Peoples through generations. Discover how plants and natural materials are used by Aboriginal people for various purposes in a hands-on learning experience. Gain an insight into how Aboriginal people source natural materials from their surroundings and have used these to adapt to the changing Australian climate for thousands of years.

The excursion activities will include:

- Journey through our native plants and discover ways in which they have traditionally been used by Aboriginal people to provide food, medicine and shelter.
- Discover how natural materials are sourced and used for a variety of cultural practices including architecture, ceremony and hunting
- Live demonstrations of tools and weapons in learning about what they are used for
