Through an enquiry process, student's will conduct a variety of field work and mapping exercises, with an aim to gain an understanding of the variety of human impacts on this threatened ecosystem, then work together on an action/enquiry plan to improve its long-term sustainability and biodiversity.

The excursion activities will include:

- Mud mapping exercise focusing on ponds management and human impacts
- Water quality testing and water bird survey
- Problem solving solutions to the pond management issues (storm water, duck feeding)
